The EYFS Framework explains how and what your child will be learning to support their healthy development.

Your child will be learning skills, acquiring new knowledge and demonstrating their understanding through 7 areas of learning and development.

Children should mostly develop the 3 prime areas first. These are:

- Communication and language;
- Physical development; and
- Personal, social and emotional development.

These prime areas are those most essential for your child's healthy development and future learning.

As children grow, the prime areas will help them to develop skills in 4 specific areas.

These are:

- Literacy;
- Mathematics;
- Understanding the world; and
- Expressive arts and design.

As a mum or dad, how can I help with my child's learning?

All the fun activities that you do with your child at home are important in supporting their learning and development, and have a really long lasting effect on your child's learning as they progress through school.

What does 'school ready' really mean? Children who:

- Have strong social skills
- •Can cope emotionally with being separated from their parents
- •Are relatively independent in their own personal care
- Have a curiosity about the world and a desire to learn

School readiness recipe

1kg – Fun and humour with a hint of cheekiness

2kg - How to get dressed and go to the loo

5kg - Good communication skills

1 dollop – willingness to try and curiosity to learn

4 tbsp – Following instructions and listening skills

Liberal pinch – creativity

Sprinkle on – self-regulation

Mix well and bake between the ages of 4 and 5 and enjoy!

Dropping off and collection arrangements

For children being dropped off at the beginning of the school day you will enter through the school gates as the other parents do, you will then wait outside the double mobile.

For children finishing at 11.45am parents can collect from Blossom class through the gates leading out to the park (near the small park)

What does my child need to bring?

Book bag

Water bottle Clear with sports cap

Wellies

Suitable outdoor coat

Fruit or vegetable snack (if they stay all day)

Drinks and Snacks



During each session the children will have the opportunity to stop for a drink and a snack

Milk is available and water for those children who do not like milk All Children are asked to bring in a named bottle to school

Snacks brought into school must be either fruit or vegetables as we are part of the 'Healthy schools' scheme

As part of the five portions of fruit or vegetables emphasis, we have a piece of fruit or vegetable provided for every child each day

This is in addition to the snack which the children are asked to bring in for their own snack.

Lunch time (for those staying all day)

If your child is staying all day an additional cost will be invoiced which is £3.45 to cover the time between sessions (45mins)

There are various options for lunch time.

Bring own packed lunch

Or have a school lunch £2.30. The children can choose from a range of items including a traditional lunch, a pasta option or jacket potato.

We are now operating a cashless system if you do want have a school lunch. Information packs available.
