BA Vision for Physical Education.

At Biggleswade Academy we aim to establish a wide ranging PE programme to develop a sporting culture; helping to improve all pupils' physical wellbeing and lifestyles. It is expected that through a planned programme of action we will promote participation, enjoyment, progress and foster a life-lasting enthusiasm and awareness of the inherent health benefits.

Primary School's Sports Funding

What is the Sports Premium?

The Government has provided funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013/14, 2014/15, 2015/16, 2016/17, 2017/2018 and 2018/2019 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools.

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools. OFSTED will play a significant role in ensuring that schools target this funding in areas which will lead to clear outcomes in raising standards and opportunities in PE and school sport for all children throughout the Primary Phase.

For this academic year the school will receive £21,600.

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this. Possible uses for the funding can include:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- New or additional sport clubs and experiences
- Paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- Running sport competitions, or increasing participation in school games
- Buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/sport
- Providing places for pupils in after school sport clubs.

It is expected that schools will see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

- 1) the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick start healthy active lifestyles.
- 2) the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
- 3) increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- 4) broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- 5) increased participation in competitive sport

Planned expenditure for 2019-2020

SSCO member of staff– LB £5500 (approx.)

Continue to provide support to existing and non-specialist staff. Link with Bikeability and sustrans to develop healthy choices of transport and opportunities to further their learning

Development of fitness area for KS1 – £5000 (approx)

Outdoor gym equipment to allow KS1 to improve fitness and build on within Health Related Fitness lessons in PE.

Development of KS2 opportunities for breaktime (£6000 approx)

Create two basketball courts on the playground with markings and sunken posts for use by all pupils during break time and lunchtime. Basketballs and padding for protection will also be required.

Transport £2000 (approx)

To provide transport for pupils to continue competing in competitions at local partnership level and county games level.

Bikeability funding - £200 (approx)

Scooter and bike provision - £1500 (approx)

Lots more pupils wish to bring scooters and bikes to school and there is not enough safe storage at both sites.

Supply Cover for participation in events and competitions organised within school time £1000 (approx.)

To enable pupils to experience competition at higher levels.

P.E. Hub (£380)

To enable staff to continue accessing updated schemes of work and to enable cover supervisors to teach should PE staff be absent long term.
